To do so, NSBTM came up with the idea of establishing a "Friends of Therapeutic Music" membership category for individuals and organizations who wish to support therapeutic music and the work of the NSBTM Board. A small tax-deductible contribution will provide the following benefits:

- Legislative alerts on issues that promote or hinder the progress of the NSBTM and its goals for the profession
- An opportunity for interaction with the NSBTM and its membership for advancement of the profession
