MHTP SALES TABLE ASSISTANT

Benefit: \$100 reduction in conference fee

This is the person assisting the Sales Table Coordinator at the conference. The Sales Table Coordinator will train the Assistant, who assists in training and overseeing the volunteers on the procedures for the sales table. Each volunteer will work in minimum1-hour shifts.

ENVIRONMENTAL & STAGE MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR

Benefit: \$150 reduction in conference fee

The Environmental and Stage Management Coordinator oversees the environmental and stage management volunteers. This person has the list of all AV equipment required for MHTP staff and presenters, locations for set-up, and times. He/she works with tech to make sure all AV needs are met. The volunteers keep the main conference room neat and welcoming, setting chairs up and keeping things orderly as the conference proceeds, if needed. This committee also assists in setting up the general areas, as needed, including registration tables and tables and chairs in presentation rooms. The committee coordinates signage for registration table and room locations. This committee assists the Breakdown/Clean-Up Committee at the end of the conference, if needed.

HOSPITALITY COORDINATOR

Benefit: \$50 reduction in conference fee

The Hospitality Coordinator trains hospitality volunteers, as well as arranges and puts welcome bags in presenters' rooms. He/she is a question and answer person (for example: Where is my room?). This person makes sure that each presenter has a host who assists him or her as needed throughout the conference and supervises hospitality volunteers, who help the registration committee with registration packets/bags and other items.

BREAKDOWN/CLEAN-UP COORDINATOR

Benefit: \$50 reduction in conference fee

This coordinator supervises Breakdown volunteers, who clean up all the spaces used for the conference as required by the conference center; checks and makes sure that the residences are left as required; removes all signage; and assists MHTP table volunteers in breakdown, if needed.
